TOWN OF ENOSBURGH SELECTBOARD MEETING

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY PIERRE LETOURNEAU AT 6:15

PRESENT WERE PIERRE LETOURNEAU, TERRY WRIGHT, LARRY GERVAIS, DEAN WRIGHT, BILLIE JO DRAPER AND ROBERT GLEASON.

MINUTES WERE NOT AVAILABLE.

ROBERT GLEASON WAS ON THE AGENDA FIRST TO DISCUSS PERSONNEL, MOTION BY TERRY WRIGHT, SECONDED BY PIERRE LETOURNEAU TO GO IN TO EXECUTIVE SESSION AT 6:17.

MOTION TO COME OUT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION BY PIERRE LETOURNEAU, SECONDED BY DEAN WRIGHT, ALL IN FAVOR, SO MOVED.

JOEY CLARK WAS ON NEXT FOR THE PAVING PROJECT THIS YEAR, PAVING WILL BE ON DUFFY HILL FROM VILLAGE LINE AND THEN IN DIFFERENT DIRECTIONS AT THE FOUR CORNERS, SHIM AND OVERLAY. A REPRESENTATIVE FROM HUTCHINS WAS HERE TO LISTEN TO PRICES.

CORRINE RYAN ASKED JOEY TO LOOK AT SINK HOLES AT THE OPERA HOUSE, HE HAS LOOKED AT THEM AND THEY ARE A COUPLE THAT CAN BE FILLED IN.

JOEY BROUGHT A PRICE FOR A HYDROSEEDER FROM MILTON RENTAL, THE COST FOR A 300 GALLON TANK, 14 OR 25 HP MOTOR WITH A HONDA MOTOR, \$5878.00, MOTION BY PIERRE LETOURNEAU TO PURCHASE THIS, SECONDED BY DEAN WRIGHT, ALL IN FAVOR, SO MOVED.

CHLORIDE PRICE IS RANGING FROM .82 TO .84 DIFFERENCE IS ABOUT \$900.00, MOTION BY TERRY TO STICK WITH GORMAN, SECONDED BY PIERRE LETOURNEAU, ALL IN FAVOR SO MOVED.

EAST BERKSHIRE FIRE DISTRICT HAD A MEETING ON THE PERLEY ROAD, ROW ON DOUG WATSON, THIS IS TO CHANGE THE EXISTING DRIVEWAY TO ANOTHER LOCATION THAT IS EASIER FOR SEEING THE TRAFFIC FOR SAFETY REASONS. JOEY PREFERS A CERTAIN ARE WITH GREATER SIGHT DISTANCE, WITH POSSIBLY HIDDEN DRIVEWAY SIGNS. TERRY WANTS IT TO PUT IN THE MOST VISABLE SPOT. SELECTBOARD CAN APPROVE THE CURB CUT BUT THEY WILL NEED TO FOLLOW UP CHANGE OF USE WITH ZONING OFFICER FOR ENOSBURGH.

SUZI WAS IN FOR THE OPERA HOUSE – ELEVATOR MAINTANCE BIDS FOR PRICING WENT OUT ALREADY, NO REPLY. PROPOSAL THAT SHOULD APPEAR IN THE PAPER, WILL WORK WITH BILLIE JO FOR ENDING DATE.

PAINTING OVER THE COURSE OF FOUR YEARS TO DO ONE SIDE A YEAR.

WATER IN BASEMENT IS AN ISSUE, ALSO SEWER BACKED UP AGAIN, NEED TO LOOK INTO THAT, AND ELEVATOR PEOPLE MAY NEED TO PUMP OUT HOLE UNDER NEATH.

RILEY BOCKUS WAS ON AGENDA ABOUT LARRY BENOITS COW PROBLEM ON STONEHOUSE ROAD. THERE IS NO GATE UP TO DATE, AND HE HAS UNTIL MAY 20TH TO GET THE FENCE UP. RILEY WAS INFORMED OF WHAT HIS RIGHTS ARE ACCORDING TO THE VERMONT LEAGUE OF CITIES AND TOWNS. RILEY WANTS TO AVOID ANY FURTHER ISSUES, HOWEVER IT IS A PROBLEM BETWEEN NEIGHBORS AND NOT FOR THE TOWN TO TAKE CARE OF, AND THE SELECTBOARD IS JUST TRYING TO MEDIATE.

THE LAST ITEM ON THE AGENDA WAS THE RECREATION COMMITTEE WITH STEVE WADSWORTH AND SHAWNA LOVELETTE. STEVE WAS EXCITED ABOUT THE GRANT THAT GAINED US 2 CANOES AND 4 KAYAKS AND NOW LOOKING INTO BUILDING A RACK ON THE BROWN PROPERTY- WAITING ON A RETURN CALL AFTER NANCY PATCH LOOKS INTO THIS. GRANT WAS \$4562.07 AND THE FUNDING THROUGH WILD AND SCENIC - \$4219.21. THEY HAVE PAID HALF AFTER THE SUBMISSION THEY WILL PAY THE OTHER HALF AFTER THE FIRST OF THE YEAR. THEY RECEIVED A FOUR THOUSAND DOLLAR RISE VERMONT GRANT. SHAWNA SUBMITTED TWO GRANTS FOR THE REC FIELDS THAT INVOLVES SIGNAGE. ANOTHER GRANT FOR THE AREA NEAR ELM STREET PROJECT IS THROUGH AARP, SHE PRESENTED A DRAFT PLANNING DOCUMENT. VISION IS TO MAKE MULTIUSE, MULTIGENERATIOINAL USE PROJECT. MAYBE A NEED TO SURVEY THE LAND THE TOWN HAS LEFT AND SOME DIRT WORK AND DRAINAGE. WITH THE 4,000 GRANT WOULD LIKE TO RESURFACE THE BASKETBALL COURT AND TURN IT INTO 2 PICKLE BALL COURTS. BIKE RACKS ARE AVAILABLE TO US FROM RISE VERMONT. THEY ARE LOOKING FOR PERMISSION TO PUT THE BIKE RACKS AND SIGN IN THE NEAR FUTURE. MOTIOIN BY DEAN TO PROCEED WITH BOTH IDEAS, SECOND BY TERRY WRIGHT, ALL IN FAVOR, SO MOVED.
