

JULY 1, 2019

Town of Enosburgh Selectboard meeting, present were Polly Rico, Terry Wright, Larry Gervais, Dean Wright, Pierre Letourneau and Billie Jo Draper.

Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved with a motion from Polly Rico, second from Terry Wright, all in favor, so moved.

Polly gave an update at this time about the committee for the grant writer. They have thought of two points, one zoning/economic development or grant writer/economic development. Steering committee would be 2 trustees, 2 selectboard and 1 person from the public.

Quote presented from Jesse Goeway for last two sides of the Opera House – problem is a lot costlier than the first two sides. Board asked for explanation on this.

Joey and Bethany came in for update on sand and salt shed as well as municipal roads grant for signature. Motion to participate in the water quality grant for municipal roads by Dean Wright, second by Polly Rico, all in favor, so moved.

Bethany explained that it was time to get the zoning permits for the project and was told we waive our own fees.

Bethany would like someone to sign the application for the permit, it was decided she would fill it out and then drop it off here at the clerk's office for signature.

Joey wanted a couple of driveway permits signed for Tim Pollock, he has a property on Enosburgh Mountain that is in the process of subdividing. Motion by Polly Rico to approve both permits and second by Dean Wright, all in favor, so moved.

Town of Richford has contacted Joey about Prive Hill and they want to get us to pay with in kind services or some type of trade. Selectboard of Enosburgh said that sounds good.

Budget adjustment for Joey was the discussion about the cost of gravel that is written in the purchase and sales agreement - \$2.00 a yard anything over 75,000 yards, so we now have to start paying this fee, Joey needs to find it elsewhere within the budget to help pay for this.

Sara Downes and Nancy Patch were on the agenda for the Enosburgh Town Forest and Conservation Commission – they discussed the letter request from Jamie St. Pierre, they said the commission voted unanimously to not do this and would turn him down. They felt that no one person should financially benefit, the soils are fragile, no four wheelers are allowed, no one would be able to monitor it, and enforcement would be difficult.
